Everybody's Working: A Theology of Work

Genesis 1 – Revelation 22 Pastor Nate Kellogg

1. Work in the garden. (Delight)

Genesis 1:1-5, 26-28.

- a. God created order and goodness from wild and waste for human flourishing.
- b. God created humans in His image.
- c. One aspect of <u>bearing</u> God's image is working to create <u>order and goodness</u> from chaos for the <u>good</u> of those around us and for God's glory. This was intended to be a delight.

2. Work <u>outside</u> the garden. (<u>Exile</u>)

Genesis 3:17-19, Jeremiah 29:4-7, Proverbs 11:10, Colossians 3:23-24

- a. Humans decided to step outside of the <u>role and position</u> God put them in, resulting in <u>exile</u> from Eden and work no longer being a delight.
- b. Even in exile God still calls humans to <u>image</u> Him by bringing order and <u>goodness</u> from the chaos throughout the rest of the Bible.
- c. God is shaping our relationships and character through our work.

3. Work in the new Garden. (Eternity)

Revelation 21:1-5, 22:1-3.

- a. A new heaven and a new earth Jesus is making all things new NOT all new things.
- b. All of the effects of the curse in Genesis 3 are undone.
- c. We will serve our King <u>forever</u> and return to Eden like <u>circumstances</u>.

Application:

- a. Pray the Lord's Prayer 5 times this week. (Matthew 6:9-13)
- b. What chaos is around you that you can work some good in for those around you and for God's glory?
- c. How might God be shaping your character and integrity in the reality of exile you are in?
- d. What future reality do you desire to pull into the here and now?
