Opposition from the Outside

1. The strategies of the enemy.

- <u>Ridicule</u> is a substitute for <u>reason</u>, laughter is a substitute for <u>logic</u>. vs. 1, cf 2:19
- <u>Resistance</u> When you <u>obey</u> God anticipate <u>opposition</u>. vs 8

Nehemiah 4:6-8 (NASB95)

6 So we built the wall and the whole wall was joined together to half its height, for the people had a mind to work.7 Now when Sanballat, Tobiah, the Arabs, the Ammonites and the Ashdodites heard that the repair of the walls of Jerusalem went on, and that the breaches began to be closed, they were very angry. 8 All of them conspired together to come and fight against Jerusalem and to cause a disturbance in it.

• <u>Rumors</u> are <u>exaggerated</u> the more they are <u>repeated</u>. vs. 12

2. The result of the attack - discouragement

- "We are only halfway there! vs. 10 <u>Fatigue</u>
- "There is too much rubble." vs. 10 Frustration
- "By ourselves we will not be able to rebuild the wall." vs. 10 Failure
- "Our enemies are going to get us." vs. 11 <u>Fear</u>

3. The response by the leader

- Nehemiah prayed to God trust in God. vs 4
- Now Nehemiah is not the only one <u>praying</u>! vs. 9
- "Posted a guard" set <u>boundaries</u> <u>protect</u> your territory. vs. 9
- Nehemiah's spiritual charge, "remember who God is!" vs. 14

Application:

- This week identify what it is you <u>value</u> and want to <u>protect</u>.
- This week set your <u>boundaries</u>.
- This week look for opportunities to <u>pray together</u>.
